## SwissAthlon Headquarters: Brooklyn Exchange Cabin

2400 State Road  
Hinckley Reservation  
Cleveland MetroParks  
Hinckley, Ohio

The location for all the events (except the Friday Pack Dog Hike - see page 7) is near the serenely beautiful Hinckley Lake Reservation, about 25 miles south of downtown Cleveland at the Brooklyn Exchange Cabin, a spacious log home secluded in the wooded MetroParks. The site includes a large pavilion, perfect for conducting the weight pulls. The locale is adjacent to flat acreage, ideal for the draft trial maneuver course. In addition, it is surrounded by miles and miles of maintained horse trails, making possible the Sunday pack dog hike and the freight haul for the draft trial. The "cabin," with its spacious wrap-around porch, features a great room with 8 harvest tables and a huge brick fireplace, a kitchen and bunkroom.

### Free T-Shirt!

Any entrant will receive a free SwissAthlon T-shirt *if* their dog enters at least one of each type of event that is a Greater Swiss Mountain Dog Club of America recognized working event - one pack dog hike, one weight pull & the draft test.

### Directions

The Hinckley Reservation is almost exactly in the middle of an area bounded by 4 interstates: I-80 to the north, I-71 to the west, I-271 to the south, I-77 to the east.

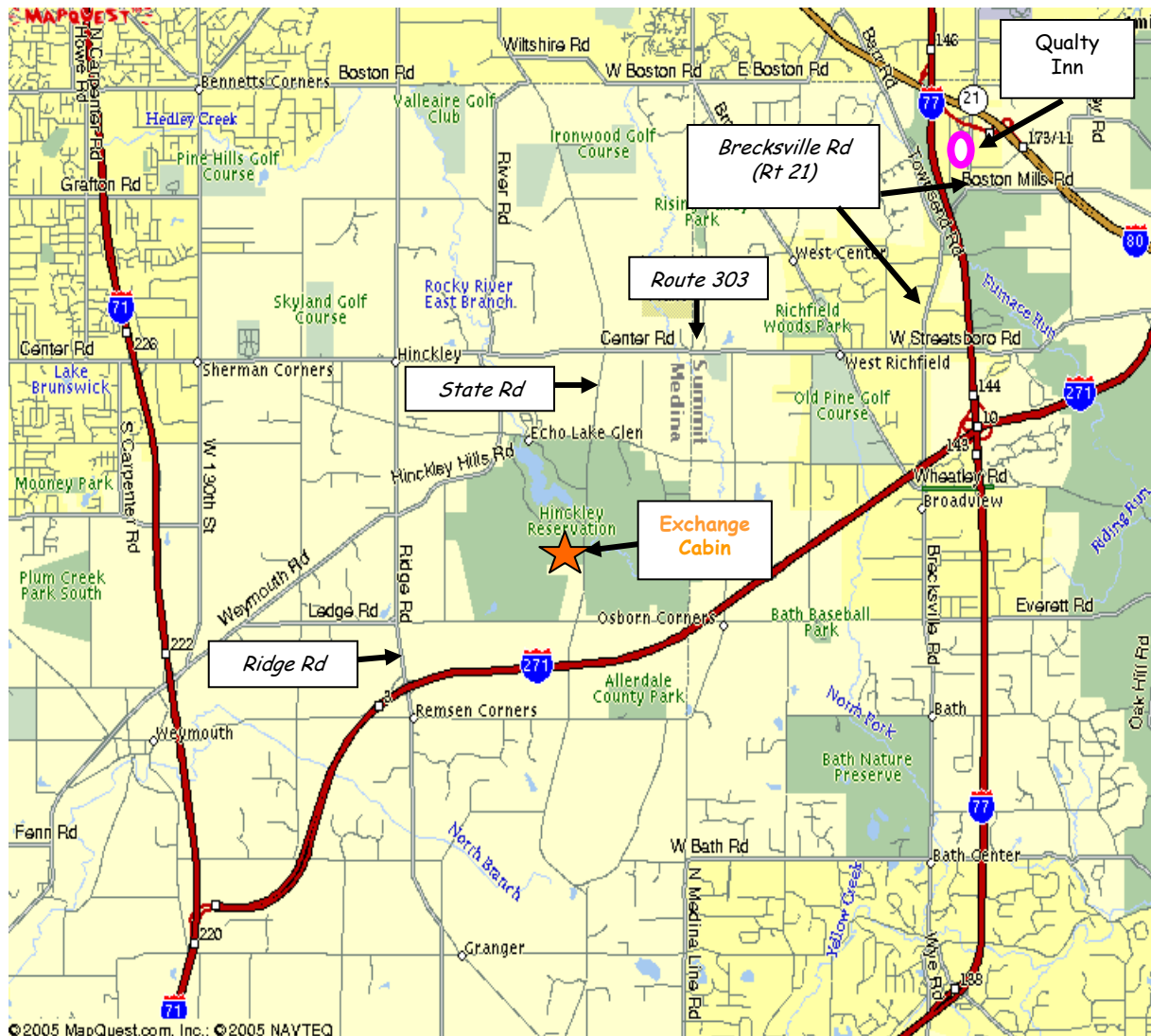
#### From the North: (I-271 & I-77)

- From I-271 - Take Exit 10 to I-77 South. Take the next exit (see below).
- From I-77 - take Exit 144 (Richfield/Peninsula).

#### From the South: (I-77)

- Take Exit 143 (Richfield/Peninsula)

- Turn **Right** onto Wheatly Rd (Rt. 176) for  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile.
- Stay straight past Brecksville Rd. (Wheatly becomes Broadview Rd.)
- At the next road, Turn **Left** on **Hawkins Rd** (it becomes **Bellus Rd.**)
- Stay on Bellus for 3.3 miles (past Southern Rd. & Medina Line Rd. & the Ranger Stables)
- At the Stop Sign, turn **Left** on **State Rd.**
- Stay on State Rd for 1.2 miles (past East and West Drives).
- The **Exchange Cabin** is on the **Right**, approx  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile past West Drive.

- From the East & West: (I-80)**
- **Take Exit 173** (Brecksville/Richfield) Past the toll Booth, keep to the right.
  - Turn **Right** on **Brecksville Rd/Rt21**. (The **Quality Inn** is approx  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile on the right). Stay on Brecksville Rd for 2 miles.
  - In Richfield, turn **Right** on **W. Streetsboro Rd (Rt 303)**. Stay on 303 for approx 3.4 miles (passing Rt, 176 & Medina Line Rd).
  - At the top of the hill (flashing yellow light), Turn **Left** on **State Rd**. Stay on State Rd for almost 2 miles (past Bellus Rd, East and West Drs.).
  - The **Exchange Cabin** is on the **Right**, approx  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile past West Dr.

- From the South: (I-71)**
- **Take I 271 North** (Exit 220 - Erie)
  - Take the first exit, **Exit 3** (North Royalton/Wadsworth).
  - Turn **Left** on **Ridge Rd (SR 94)**. Go .7 of a mile.
  - Turn **Right** on **Ledge Rd**. Go approx 2 miles.
  - At the 2d stop sign, Turn **Left** on **State Rd**. Go approx .6 of a mile.
  - The **Exchange Cabin** is on the **Left**.

## LODGING

As in past years, we are encouraging SwissAthlon participants to stay at the site of all the action, the Brooklyn Exchange Cabin. In the interest of trying to break even on the cost of renting the site for the weekend, we are asking a fee of only \$25.00 per household for the weekend. This fee applies whether you are sleeping inside the lodge or outside in your tent or RV.

The "cabin," with its spacious wrap-around porch, features a great room with 8 harvest tables and a huge brick fireplace. At one end of the room is the kitchen, boasting two stoves, three refrigerators, a long counter, and shelving. **\*\*\*Since there is no indoor plumbing, the sink is faucetless, but it does drain water.**

A doorway from the great room leads into the bunkroom. Wooden bunk beds sleep 30 people, but this room is so spacious that it can accommodate cots and bedding for more people. The bunkroom features a huge fireplace, as well. Chopped wood is provided by the MetroParks for burning in the fireplaces. If you want to sleep on a bunk bed, **bring very cushy bedding**, as the bunk beds are wooden. If you want to use floor space for sleeping, please bring a cot or air mattress to ensure the comfort level you will need.

Although the "cabin" has electricity, it has no central heat. If the October nights turn chilly, we can provide electric space heaters. It is recommended that you bring a warm bedroll and/or sleeping bag and pillow to ensure a good night's sleep. There is *ample* crating space for the dogs indoors as well as outdoors on the wrap around porch.

For those who like to pitch a tent, there is plenty of green space next to and behind the cabin to set up camp. There should also be room for an RV or two in the parking lot. Running water is available outdoors at the hand pump in front of the "cabin." The well water is quite tasty! Latrines housed in wooden structures are "on site" toilet facilities. In addition, a handicapped port-a-potty will be available.

For those of you who do not want to "camp," either indoors or outdoors at the site, there are hotels which take dogs located 7 miles from site. A **Super 8 Motel** is located at 4845 Brecksville Road, Richfield, OH 44286-9621 / **Phone: (330)659-6888**. While the Super 8 room rates are reasonable, the motel charges a \$10.00/night fee for dogs. The **Quality Inn** is across the street at 4742 Brecksville Road (Rt 21), Richfield, OH 44286 / **Phone: (330)659-6151**. The Quality Inn charges a more expensive room rate and pet fee. If you do not want to stay at the cabin, (and we hope you do!), please call either of these lodging establishments for a reservation.

## MEALS

Following the conclusion of the weight pull, we hope everyone will want to go to dinner together at Fisher's Café' and Pub in Peninsula, OH. (Address: 1607 Main Street, Peninsula, OH 44264) Fisher's serves up appetizers, dinners, sandwiches, and good pub food including wings, chili, and soups. It's about a 20 minute drive to Fisher's.

## Other Offered Events

The Crooked River Swissy Club SwissAthlon is offering other fun events during the weekend.

- **CGC Testing** - AKC - licensed CGC tester, Ann Hansen, will be available to administer the required exercises so that your dog can earn its CGC (Canine Good Citizen) designation. For dogs to be eligible, they must be at least 6 months of age. Please bring the dog's date of birth and his AKC or ILP registration number. Cost per dog is \$10.00 and you can sign up when you arrive for the weekend. CGC testing is scheduled Friday between 1:00 and 4:00 PM.
- **Barrel Racing** - Saturday, during the late afternoon or early evening, we are offering a game for dogs and their owners/handlers. Two teams of four (handlers and their dogs) will match up against one another to see which team can race out to its appointed barrel, send their dog around their appointed barrel, and race back across the finish line with their dog. No entry fee, and prizes will be awarded.
- **Puppy Match** - Following Barrel Racing, Skip Conant will judge the Puppy Match. Entry forms will be available the day of the Match and the entry fee is \$5.00 per puppy. The last three years, all of the entrants had so much fun showing off their puppies. Prizes will be awarded.
- **Raffle** - A table of donated items will be displayed for the raffle. Cost for the raffle will be \$1.00 per ticket, \$5.00 for 6 tickets, and \$10.00 for lucky number 13 tickets! # PACK DOG HIKES

## Course Descriptions

**Friday, October 2nd: Boston Run Trail - Pack Weigh - In at Trailhead is 10:00 AM**  
Trailhead is .8 miles west of Rt. 8. Boston Run Trail is 3.1 miles of moderate difficulty through treecover and rolling hills with a stream crossing. From there we cross the street via a tunnel under Rt. 303 and walk up the driveway for the (now closed) Happy Days Center into the Virginia Kendall unit of the Cuyahoga Valley National Park. By using Haskell Run Trail from the Happy Days Center we connect to Ledges Trail, another moderate difficulty trail. Again through forested areas and around the bottom of the ledges we will hike half of this trail outward, taking a connector trail approximately halfway through the 2.2 mile trail we will bridge to Pine Grove trail. Aptly named, this trail winds its way through towering pine forests. We will use the southern end of Pine Grove Trail to access a connector trail to Lake Trail, which circles Kendall Lake. We will hike the East half of Kendall Lake trail, before splitting off onto Salt Run Trail, a 3.2 mile loop through a variety of trees, ferns and wildflowers. When we return to the Lake Trail intersect, we will follow the rest of Lake Trail back to Pine Grove trail and retrace our steps back to Ledges Trail. We will hike the 2nd half of the 1.8 mile Ledges Trail and return to the parking lot to end our hike. Further trail descriptions can be found in Trail Guide: Cuyahoga Valley National Park published by the Cuyahoga Valley Trails Council. The Boston Run Trail portion is a 3.1 mile loop so the trail is never more than 1.6 miles from a vehicle for transportation. The Salt Lake Trail, a 3.2 mile loop is near Kendall Lake where there is parking lot to leave a vehicle for transportation. It is only two miles between the two parking lots, so once again, no part of any trail in the 10 mile hike is more than 3 miles from a parked vehicle for transportation.

### Directions to the Boston Run Trailhead

#### From the East & West (I-80 Turnpike)

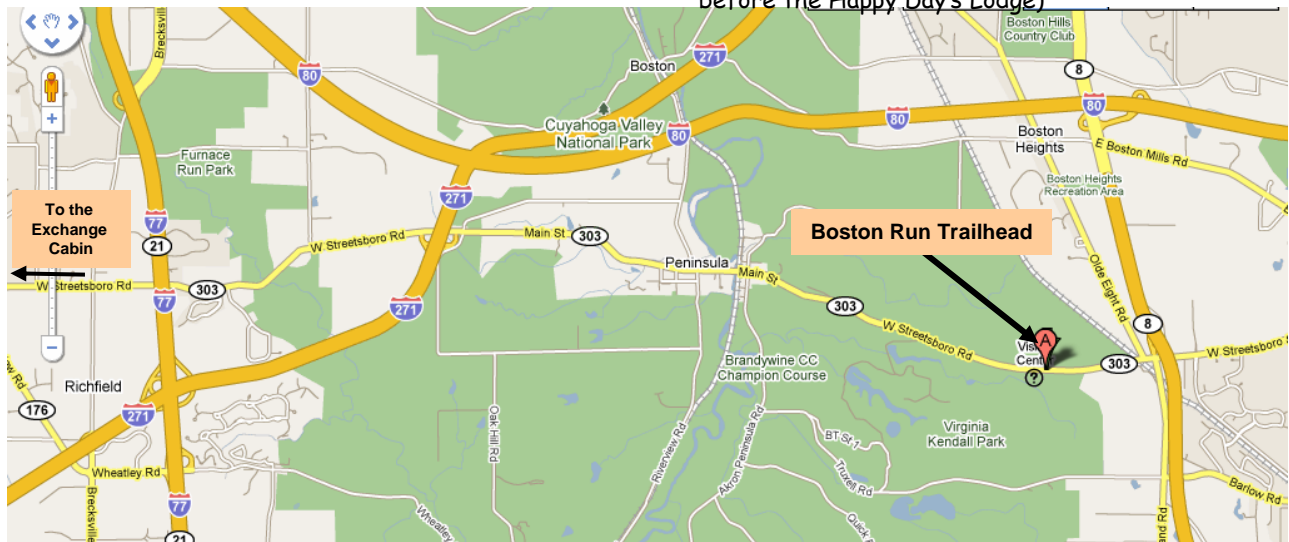
- Take exit 180 to merge onto OH-8 South for 2.5 mi.
- Take the OH-303 exit toward Peninsula/Hudson. Turn right at OH-303/W Streetsboro Rd (signs for Peninsula).
- The trailhead is .8 of a mile on the right side (just before the Happy Day's Lodge)

#### From the South (I-71)

- (I-71) Take exit 220 to merge onto I-271 N toward Erie PA for 12.4 mi
- (I-71) Take exit 12 for OH-303 toward Richfield/Peninsula Turn right at Main St/OH-303 (signs for Peninsula)
- Continue to follow OH-303 for miles, the Trailhead is on the left, just past the Happy Day's Lodge

#### From the South (I-77)

- Take the OH-303 exit toward Peninsula/Hudson. Turn left at OH-303/W Streetsboro Rd (signs for Peninsula).
- The trailhead is 1 mile on the right side (just before the Happy Day's Lodge)



## **PACK DOG HIKES (cont)**

### **Course Descriptions (cont)**

**Sunday, October 4th· Hinckley Lake Hike, Exchange Cabin. Pack Weigh in: 8:00 am**

At the southern end of Cleveland Metroparks is Hinckley Reservation, the site of the nationally known annual return of the buzzards. Located in Hinckley Township in Medina County, the reservation is dominated by the 90-acre Hinckley Lake, enjoyed by fishermen, canoe and kayak enthusiasts, walkers, joggers, bird watchers and dog lovers. Two other attractions in the reservation are Whipp's Ledges, with elevations rising 350 feet above Hinckley Lake and formed more than 250 million years ago, as well as Worden's Ledges with its unique carvings made in the 1940s by Noble Stuart, son-in-law to the namesake of the ledges, Hiram Worden, both which we will be traversing in the course of our hike.

The 90 miles of trails circling the greater Cleveland area and Lake Erie is known as the "Emerald Necklace." Sunday's 10 mile pack dog hike will wind through a portion of this scenic area. Trail surfaces will be dirt-packed, gravel, grassy, and asphalt. Northeast Ohio is known for its ridges and hilly terrain. Hiking the trails, you can be assured that if you go down a hill, you will also go up a hill. The Hinckley Lake Hike will encounter a small stream/creek where we will be crossing either by walking in the water or stepping across on stones. Many of the trails are horse trails through the heavily forested park area, providing not only beauty but also shade.

### **Administrative Details**

The Pack Dog Hikes will be conducted per the GSMDCA Pack Dog Rules effective September 1, 2005. All GSMD's over 18 month the day of the hike are eligible for Working Pack Dog Titles.

The Friday hike will begin at 10:00 AM with the weigh-in of the packs. The Sunday morning hike will begin at 8:00 AM with weigh-in of the packs. Immediately following weigh-in, dogs and handlers will "hit the trail."

First and foremost, hikes are to be conducted with the safety and well being of the GSMD's and Handlers in mind. The Hike Coordinator is authorized to make any necessary decisions to protect the safety and well being of the GSMD's and Handlers.

Only one dog per handler is allowed.

A veterinarian's certificate of the dog's weight must be provided prior to weigh-in. The weight may be taken up to 7days prior to the hikes. Weight verifications may be in any format as long as they include the name and address of the vet (e.g. vet letterhead, vet business cards & vet prescription pads).

### **Entry Fees**

Entry fees for the pack dog hikes are \$20.00 per dog OR \$30.00 per dog if entered both days. *Pre-entry is required.* If you want to enter the pack dog hikes, please check the appropriate boxes on the "Events Summary and Sign Up Page." Don't forget to include the amount of your pack dog hike entry fee(s) with the payment check you submit.

All entrants will receive a participatory prize.

### **Weather**

We chose this time of year for our SwissAthlon weekend because, characteristically, the weather is sunny with mild temperatures, highs in the upper 60's to lower 70's. We hope that fair skies prevail for this very special event. Please be advised that in some years, northeast Ohio has experienced rain or even a dusting of snow in early October. On the other hand, we had warmer than normal temperatures last year with abundant sunshine. Please tune into the weather on the internet and dress accordingly. The events will go forward, rain or shine.

## WEIGHT PULLS

Two weight pull competitions under GSMDCA rules are featured during the SwissAthlon weekend. They will take place at the Brooklyn Exchange Cabin under the pavilion on Friday afternoon following the pack dog hike and Saturday afternoon following the draft trial.

Mary & Tim Cunningham, our judges from Kirkwood, Illinois, will bring the weight pull cart, a scale to weigh the dogs, as well as bags of dog treats for the entrants.

Entry fees are discussed on the "Events Summary and Sign Up Sheet," but here is a recap.

The fees to enter your dog(s) each day in the weight pull competitions are as follows:

- \$20.00 for the first dog *if your dog has been entered in previous weight pulls.*
- \$15.00 for the first dog *if this is your dog's debut pull.* In other words if your dog has *never been entered in a previous pull*, your entry fee for the first dog is \$15.00.
- \$10.00 for the second dog and each dog thereafter.

Hence, if you have three dogs you want to enter in the weight pull competitions, *each day*, your total entry fee is going to be either  $\$20.00 + \$10.00 + \$10.00 = \$40.00$  .... Or,  $\$15.00 + \$10.00 + \$10.00 = \$35.00$

We will have extra weight pull harnesses available for those dogs who have never pulled and would like to enter.

It is greatly appreciated if you pre-enter your dog(s). However, we will accept entries the days of the pulls.

Trophies will be awarded to the dogs who achieve

- ❖ Most Weight Pulled
- ❖ Most Weight Pulled Per Body Pound

Dogs pulling 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> place in their respective weight classes will receive a prize.

Weight classes are as follows:

- Under 90 pounds
- 90 to 109 pounds
- 110 to 129 pounds
- 130 and over pounds

### ENTRY INFORMATION

**Definitions:** The term *dog* applies to dogs of both sexes. The term *team* means a handler and his/her dog. All terms and instructions and regulations that refer to a single dog also apply to a pair of dogs working together unless otherwise noted.

### IMPORTANT DETAILS

1. Entered dogs must be 18 months or older on the day of the Draft Test (date of birth on or before April 3, 2008).
2. Bitches in season are not permitted to compete. Entry fees shall be refunded upon receipt of a veterinary certificate stating an entered bitch is in season at the time of the Draft Test.
3. No dogs belonging wholly or in part to the Draft Test Judges or the Draft Test Secretary, or to any member of their immediate family, may compete.
4. The Basic Control Exercise shall be waived for dogs that have earned an AKC, UKC, SKC, CKC Companion Dog (CD) title **IF** a copy of the CD title certificate is sent with the entry form. In the event the CD requirements were met, but the title certificate has not yet been received, the entrant may so state on the form and in a separate letter attached to the entry. If the dog passes the Draft Test, the NDD or DD title and certificate will be withheld until after the Draft Work Committee (DWC) Chairman receives a copy of the CD title certificate.
5. Handlers must provide the draft rig and weight for the freight haul. Any of the following draft rigs may be used: cart, wagon, sled, toboggan, or travois. Each of these must be equipped so that the draft rig cannot run up on the dog when hauling downhill.
6. The handler selects and provides appropriate freight load for the apparatus and the dog.
7. Entrants are responsible for obtaining the GSMDCA Draft Test Regulations and being familiar with them. Regulations are available on the GSMDCA web site ([www.gsmdca.org](http://www.gsmdca.org)) or from Karen Conant, DWC Chairman. Please send \$1.00 (to cover the cost of s&h) to Karen Conant, 34390 Detroit Rd., Avon, OH 44011.

## DRAFT TEST (cont)

### ENTRY INFORMATION (cont)

Entry is limited to fifteen (15) teams total, whether entered in **Novice Draft, Open Draft or Team Draft**. If more than 15 entries are received, a random drawing will be held within 48 hours of the closing time. Although it is the policy of the GSMDCA to invite and encourage **any** dog to enter a GSMDCA Draft Test, **GSMDs** will be given preference over other breeds. All entrants will be notified by e-mail or U.S. mail of their entry status. Alternates will also be drawn and may compete in the absence of regular entries.
